Joseph Pulvermacher (Oak Creek, WI) – Mr. Pulvermacher is a Battalion Chief with the City of Oak Creek Fire Department, a position he has held for 6 years. He began his career with Oak Creek as a Firefighter in 1993. Prior to joining Oak Creek Pulvermacher was a Firefighter, Senior Airman with the United States Air Force. Pulvermacher completed his Bachelor's degree in Fire Service Management at Southern Illinois University. He is also a graduate of the National Fire Academy Executive Fire Officer program.

Terrence Vavra (Lake Zurich, IL) – Mr. Vavra holds a Master's degree from Benedictine University in Management and Organizational Behavior. Mr. Vavra's career includes over 20 years with the Lisle Woodridge Fire District where he held multiple positions, the most recent being Deputy Chief. Mr. Vavra has spent the past 7 years as Fire Chief for the Village of Buffalo Grove.

Trisha Wolford (Edgewater, MD) – Ms. Wolford holds a Bachelor's degree from Shepherd University and is currently enrolled in the National Fire Academy Executive Fire Officer program. Ms. Wolford is a Lieutenant/Fire Marshal for the Anne Arundel County Fire Department in Millersville, MD where she has been employed for nearly 10 years.
