Medicare Part D Open Enrollment Gives Opportunity to Save Money

Open enrollment for 2016 Part D plans runs through **December 7, 2015**. This is the time that Medicare beneficiaries who are enrolled in Part D plans can review their plan to determine if it will still be the most cost-effective in 2016. Because insurance companies can change their premiums, deductibles and co-pays, switching to a different plan could result in extra money in your pocket!

Another way to save money on prescriptions is the Extra Help program. Extra Help reduces your costs by decreasing premiums, deductibles and co-pays for medications based on your income and assets. If you are single and your income is less than \$1,471/month, and your assets are below \$12,140, you may qualify for Extra Help.

If you have coverage through a Medicare Advantage Plan, you are also able to make changes to your coverage during open enrollment. For help with Advantage plans, please call the Medigap Helpline at 1-800-242-1060. For help with either Medicare Part D or the Extra Help program, call the Fitchburg Senior Center at 270-4290 and ask to speak with a Social Worker.



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REACH Book Club

REACH Book will meet on December 10, 2015.

We will discuss the book, *Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker* by Jennifer Chiaverini. Chiaverini tells the story of Elizabeth Hobbs Keckley, who was born a slave. She earned her freedom by the skill of her needle and won the friendship of First Lady Mary Todd Lincoln with her devotion. Elizabeth Keckley supported the First Lady through years of war, political strife, and devastating personal losses, even as she endured heartbreaking tragedies of her own. Even more daring, Keckley not only made history but also wrote it in her own words, which placed her at the center of a scandal. It was something she never intended to happen. You might want to read her memoir, *Behind the Scenes: Or, Thirty Years a Slave, and Four Years in the White House* and compare her story with that told by Chiaverini. Her book is available in hardcover as well as a free download for Kindle and other devices.

Are high energy costs getting you down? The Home Energy Plus Program may be able to help! Who qualifies for energy assistance? Households whose total gross income falls below the following (for the three months immediately preceding the month of application): \$6,400 for a one-person household; \$8,370 for a two-person household. Grants are also determined based on energy costs and dwelling type. If you need help making an appointment or getting to the appointment site, please call the Fitchburg Senior Center at 270-4290 and ask to speak with one of the Social Workers.

 - Beginners should have a soprano uke (standard size) or concert uke (like a soprano but longer due to a bit more space on the fret board where your fingers go to make the chords)**
 - It’s not a big investment. Check out local stores to try, price and possibly purchase a ukulele.**
