

# Lacy Road Reconstruction Update

August 31, 2017

The Lacy Road Construction Project has continued to make great progress with the nice weather! Underground pipe work is just about completed and grading work is west of Glen Arbor Way. We are heading into a holiday weekend, so work will suspend on Friday for the long weekend. Crews will return on Tuesday and anticipate the following work (weather dependent):

- Surveying and staking, continues throughout the project
- Cleanup of underground work
- Grading of Lacy Road and placement of base aggregate from Glen Arbor to the west end
- Placement of base aggregate throughout the project
- Electrical conduit installation
- Curb and gutter work late next week from Fahey Glen to the west end. String line will be set on Tuesday and Wednesday
- Construction of retaining wall west of Sunflower Drive

## Traffic:

- Work from the west end to Mica Road will be tight, but local traffic will be allowed through.
- *Mica, Fahey Glen and Notre Dame Drive Traffic and all Lacy Road residents east of Fahey Glen should head **east** out of Lacy Road to Sunflower Drive.*
- *Concrete work from Fahey Glen to the west end will likely cause some delays for traffic. Travel to the east using Sunflower is recommended*
- The new roundabout is now clearly defined with curb & gutter and signs are there to assist local traffic.

- PLEASE give construction traffic plenty of room – stay back at least 100 feet. They stop, turn, backup and dump loads very frequently. The equipment operators have a hard time seeing cars that are too close to them.

Road Closed to Thru Traffic means “local traffic only”. So what is local traffic? “Local Traffic” refers to vehicles that have an origin or destination inside the work zone. This includes but is not limited to Lacy Rd residents, businesses, delivery trucks, emergency vehicles and school buses. Or in other words, unless you are going to an address or leaving an address within the construction zone from City Hall to Syene Road, you must use an alternate route.

We would also like to remind motorists that it is illegal to use a handheld cellphone in construction zones.

Road construction is inconvenient for motorists and residents. We want to thank you for doing your part to keep everyone safe in the construction zone.
