

Lacy Road Reconstruction Update

The Lacy Road Construction is pushing forward! Pay special attention to the notes **in bold** below and be prepared that traffic **WILL BE IMPACTED** next week during surface paving.

Here is the upcoming anticipated work that will occur in many areas of the project (weather dependent):

- Electrical wiring and new street lights
- Placement of topsoil, landscaping, seeding and placement of erosion mat
- Cleaning and sweeping of the roadway prior to surface
- The final surface layer of asphalt is tentatively planned for next week – Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
*****Please note that traffic will be impacted for this round of paving. Any traffic that drives on the asphalt too soon will cause permanent damage**
- **Garbage collection on Thursday October 5th will be before 6:30am**

Traffic:

- **During Surface Paving – the plan is to start at the east end near Syene and pave west. Flaggers and barricades will be set to limit access in areas. Traffic coming out of a side road will only be allowed to go one direction. Please slow down and watch for barricades and flaggers. Message boards will also be placed at the west end, Sunflower and Syene to indicate where you can get access to. These will change as the paving progresses each day.**
- **Mica Road will be closed during paving operations. Only school busses will be allowed through.**
- Contractors have the right of way
- PLEASE slow down in the construction zone. Speeds have increased making it dangerous for traffic and workers.
- PLEASE give construction traffic plenty of room – stay back at least 100 feet. They stop, turn, backup and dump loads very frequently. The equipment operators have a hard time seeing cars that are too close to them.

Road Closed to Thru Traffic means “local traffic only”. So what is local traffic? “Local Traffic” refers to vehicles that have an origin or destination inside the work zone. This includes but is not limited to Lacy Rd residents, businesses, delivery trucks, emergency vehicles and school buses. Or in other words, unless you are going to an address or leaving an address within the construction zone from City Hall to Syene Road, you must use an alternate route.

We would also like to remind motorists that it is illegal to use a handheld cellphone in construction zones.

Road construction is inconvenient for motorists and residents. We want to thank you for doing your part to keep everyone safe in the construction zone.
